Arnesby Loseby Charity Trust – a brief history

"Loseby's Charity" was founded by a will in 1668, formalised into a Charity Trust in 1879, in which land was made available to be divided into 'field gardens' (allotments) for rent by the poor people of Arnesby. After paying any maintenance costs, the charity was to give 1/6th of excess of income towards the maintenance of the village wells and highways, 1/6th for the repair of the Parish Church, and of the remainder, up to 5/- (5 old shillings = 25p) could be used for the benefit of poor deserving parishioners of good character who had fallen on hard times, by providing (e.g.) clothes or bedding, or by small grants or loans.

I believe there are still villagers who remember when the allotments field on the A5199 was entirely filled with allotments. And who also remember that their families received gifts at Christmas from the charity.

Although allotments are said to be more popular than ever, there does not seem to be much demand from Arnesby residents and some of the present allotments are let to people from other nearby villages. Some of the land is now used as meadow and Loseby Wood was planted 10 years ago.
