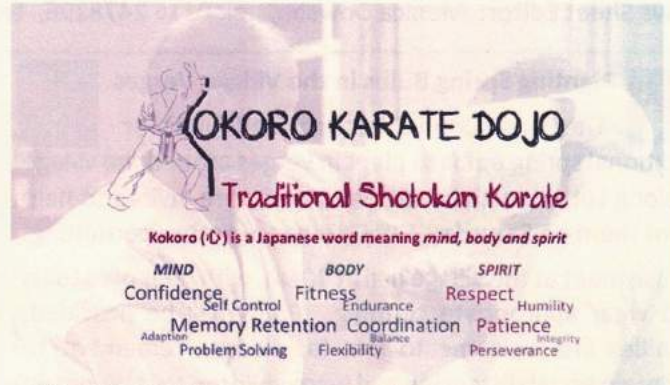

Trees in your Garden

The Parish Council wishes to draw attention to home owners and residents in the village, the position with regard to works to trees, lying within individual properties.

Most of Arnesby is within the Conservation Area and all trees are therefore protected. Therefore, works cannot take place, including pruning, lopping and felling, without formal consent which has to be approved by Harborough District Council. Unauthorised works to such trees is a crime and will result in a high fine if prosecuted, but this does not normally apply to trees which are:

- Less than 75mm trunk diameter (measured 1.5 m above ground) or
- Less than 100mm trunk diameter (measured 1.5m above the ground) if it is to help the growth of affected adjacent trees.

Outside the Conservation Area, individual trees may be covered by a Tree Preservation Order and in this case, any works require formal consent from HDC (as above). It is the responsibility of property owners to establish whether the trees in respect of which works are proposed, are protected and thus require formal consent.
