# Arnesby Parish Council Meeting Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> May at 7.30pm

This meeting was held on 'Zoom'. You can see the full minutes at: <a href="www.arnesbyparishcouncil.org.uk">www.arnesbyparishcouncil.org.uk</a> or on the village notice boards.

Items discussed included:

- Thanks to Sue Cooper and all volunteers for community support provided to villagers See report on the right ->
- Tree Survey Report agreed two trees should be removed as recommended in the report
- Purchase of plants for village planters £250 agreed
- Planning application for erection of single storey rear extension at Ferndale House, Mill Hill Road approved by Parish Council
- Boundary of building site on Oak Lane contractor has assured council that the hedge will be attended to. Council suggested trees should be retained.
- The County Council has suspended cutting roadside verges unless it poses a visual hazard. Some people are disappointed that verges are not being cut, others approve that they are being left to encourage wildflowers & insects.
- With recent encouragement to cycle, it was agreed the Council will investigate the availability of grants to create a cycle/footpath to the gated road.

#### **Arnesby Coronavirus Volunteers**

Reprint of Report presented at Parish Council Meeting

Early on it was discovered that there was no need to set up a formal register of either the vulnerable and isolating people or volunteers. Good neighbours and volunteers were quickly identified and came from all directions, whether through WhatsApp groups or other social networks in the village.

Volunteers and friends have been keeping in regular touch with those who are locked down by doing shopping and delivering essentials as well as responding to requests for jigsaws, magazines, books and suggestions for entertaining children to keep everyone fed and occupied. There have also been requests to take post to the post office and other small errands.

More than 50 prescriptions were collected and delivered during the first few weeks, saving numerous journeys for shielded or vulnerable people and reducing contacts for people in the village at the surgery and chemist. Having talked to many people, the volunteers know that most people in the village have family or friends who are calling on them regularly, but if they are worried about anyone, they know how to contact the volunteer coordinators.

The co-ordinating group has explored a number of avenues for organising food supplies. Wholesalers and commercial suppliers have been found problematic because of the large size and quantity of their produce. More useful has been the vegetable and fruit boxes and other small food items available from pop-up shops at local pubs and restaurants.
