- During the negotiations regarding the new 3 year lease of the village playing field an objection was raised by Oscar Briggs, land owner, regarding the designation of the playing field as an Important Open Space in the Arnesby Neighbour Hood Plan, which is currently being completed. He had suggested that he would be uncomfortable leasing the land to the Arnesby Parish Council with such a designation in place as this would be a potential detriment to future generations who may wish to develop the land.
- Zandra Byatt proposed that the Parish Council agree to removing the Important Open Space designation on condition that the new lease period be extended to 10 years, as the last agreement was, thus protecting the use of the Village Playing Field for parishioners for a longer term. Seconded by Jennifer Lees, passed unanimously.
