Arnesby Neighbourhood Plan Review -

A Community Event was held on November 11th when the new draft Arnesby Neighbourhood Plan, as Reviewed, was displayed with an opportunity to seek answers to questions from those who have been working over the last twelve months on this project. This was well attended, and observations made and noted.



The next stage of the process is to finalise the document and submit to Harborough D C for Pre-Examination. This document will be published on the website so Parishioners can further view the same.
