Thank you for getting in touch and I'm sorry to hear there's been another burst on the mains pipe on the A5199

The team have been working to make design changes to get this section of pipe moved over to the new pipe as guickly as possible. We will need to apply for traffic light permits to work on the road and prior to that we'll need to carry out Chlorination of the new pipe and water sampling for two weeks to make sure everything meets the required standards before connecting this section of the water pipe

I will keep you updated with progress on when this work will take place.

# Flood Support - Early January I was forwarded the below, which may be of interest to one or two -

"In response to Tuesday's severe weather event and the on-going risk due to saturated ground, Harborough District Council is urgently investigating how it might be able to provide localised support to affected parishes.

The offer to parish councils and parish meetings will certainly include an initial supply of sandbags to be stored in a variety of places across the district to be used in emergency situations, and support through the Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland Local Resilience Forum (LRF) for reviewing or creating a Community Resilience Plan, including a call for volunteer flood wardens.

Cllr Knowles, Leader of Harborough District Council, said: "We understand how devastating flooding of a property can be and the worry it causes to residents. Harborough is a large rural district, and our support team can't be everywhere at once. So I am pleased to make sandbags available for our affected parish areas and we will work together to see what further support can be offered."

The impact of Storm Henk was felt in areas across the whole of the district. The first set of sandbags will be delivered to Broughton Astley this week.

Officers will be in contact to discuss requirements in due course."

# - Arnesby Sewage Overflow - Submitted by Terry Cane

The Severn Trent Arnesby Sewage Treatment Works at the bottom of Arnesby Hill, off the Lutterworth Road, recorded 73 overflows lasting 843 hours in 2022. (figures for 2023 have not yet been published). This means that at times of overflow untreated sewage is discharging into Countesthorpe Brook. The overflows at Arnesby are similar to the discharges from other treatment works in the area.

The Parish Council has said it will ask Severn Trent for comment. Further information can be found at, **theriverstrust.org/key-issues/sewage-in-rivers**. Remember only toilet paper, pee and poo down the loo.

# Village Hall AGM –

There was a good turnout on 30<sup>th</sup> November and much discussion about the projects being proposed. Trustees were appointed (welcome to Cathy Roberts who is a new Trustee) and there were reports from the Chair and the Treasurer. #### 1. Refurbishment Work -

The good news is that a programme of larger work for 2024 was agreed – see below: -

- Priority 1
  - Repair the roof where the rooflight is leaking £1,320 to be done in February.
  - Apply for planning and install solar panels (to reduce the energy costs) £15,000 Planning application has been submitted and will be Considered by MHDC in March.
  - Toilet refurbishment £25,000 Summer holidays \*
- Priority 2 -
  - O Decorate the hall estimate £3,000 dates to be agreed.
  - New curtains estimate £1,500 dates to be agreed.
- Priority 3
  - o Re sand and polish the floor estimate £3,000 dates to be agreed if funding for this year.

The works above can be funded from existing funds but grant applications will continue to be made for the installation of the solar panels.

toilet refurbishment - £25,000 - Summer holidays

**Note** - \* It's hoped that the toilet refurb can be done for 2024 summer holidays if grant funding can be raised to cover some or all of the costs.

#### 2. Running Costs -

Costs to run the village hall have increased and are about to be even higher when our fixed price energy contract runs out.

- Trustees agreed that we need to cover day to day costs (energy use, cleaning costs, minor works) from bookings. Fundraising and donations should be used to do larger building works.
- Hall booking charges haven't been raised for many years and don't cover running costs. It was agreed that to balance
  our costs we would raise our rates from January from £5/hr to £7.50/hr for village users and from £7.50 to £10 for
  external users. The charge for the school has been increased on a sliding scale over three years, increasing by £300 in
  the first year, reflecting their usage of the hall during term time.

#### 3. Fund Raising -

- Supper Club -
  - The first Pop Up supper club event was a big success on 9th December.
  - o Phil Pictures to be sent by WhatsApp.
  - £500 was donated to the village hall fund. Lots of people said they'd like to do it again and some people were mad enough to say they would be happy to help, so we are going to do another in the Spring.

#### • Village Hall Lottery -

Trustees have pounded the streets, cajoled their families and friends, and sold 250 tickets at £10 each for the new lottery.

Profits will be used to raise funds for the work to the hall. If you have been in a coma or never answer your door and don't know what I'm talking about ;-)

There will be a monthly prize draw on 15th of each month. There are three prizes, £50, £30 and £10. Better odds than the national lottery but slightly smaller jackpot.... Winners will be contacted directly, but we will also post the lucky numbers on WhatsApp and in the newsletter.

Winners of the first draw on 15th January were tickets 47, 14 and 61 - Sue Spriggs, Penny Elliot and one other (in the village, but we have been unable to ask whether we can disclose their name).

#### 4. Treasurer for the Village Hall

After 40 years doing an absolutely sterling job, Terry Emmony would like to stand down from his role as Treasurer for the village hall

We are very grateful to Terry for all his work. He has done so much over all that time, far more than any usual Treasurer and has now brought us in the 21st C by setting us up with online banking – so whoever takes over will have a much simpler task.

If anyone is interested in this position, please could you let Sue Cooper know. Terry will support anyone into the role, and you won't be alone because there is an Operations group of 6 people.

Whilst we are begging...we also need someone who can deal with our:

- Insurance broker on an annual basis only and
- someone who will check our accounts which go once a year to the Charity Commission.
