Arnesby Bats to Victory Despite Bowling Pressure from Fleckney!

2nd June- Arnesby began the day fielding to a packed out crowd at the Fleckney oval, accompanied by the music of the Fleckney festival. The match, however, certainly being the prime attraction.

Opening the bowling was captain Henry Lees, leading from the front with consistency and poise. George Jackson, also opening, attacking the crease with the ferocity to put fear into the Fleckney opening batsmen. Arnesby's fielding started and continued to be active ensuring opening maiden overs for both Henry and George J. George Jackson taking the opening wicket in his second over.

Next up to bowl was David Hawkins and George Lees who continued to pack on the pressure to the teetering Fleckney batsmen. George taking a wicket on his first ball! Fleckney at this point putting up a dogged fight against a relentless Arnesby onslaught. Also bowling were the stalwart Alex Jefferies and wonder sub Jack Pickering who both picked up 2 and 1 wickets respectively.

Closing out the bowling in decisive style was Alpesh showing off to his adoring family in the audience with a wicket in his second over. Shout outs to all the fielders making a fantastic display. Notably Max White making a glorious diving catch midway through the game.

Fleckney were restricted to 139 for 8 off 40 overs.

Arnesby opened the batting with Joe Luzzi and George Lees. Joe's wickets fell to the first ball of the game, surprising onlookers with an unusual wild swing from an accomplished batsman. George Lees and Dave Hawkins took up the mantle with George hitting back with 11 in the first over. Dave held out for 8 runs, then successive dispatches of Max White and Alpesh Divecha for ducks put the pressure back on a potentially complacent Arnesby batting team. George Jackson came in at 6 to anchor however, although off to shaky start, was able to form an excellent partnership with George. The double George attack worked, putting Arnesby 15 runs away from victory before George L was forced to retire at 81 runs to perform fatherly duties. Wyndham Hogg was able to come in and clean up 11 runs to see Arnesby to a leisurely victory. George Jackson not out for 27.

Extreme reading challenge

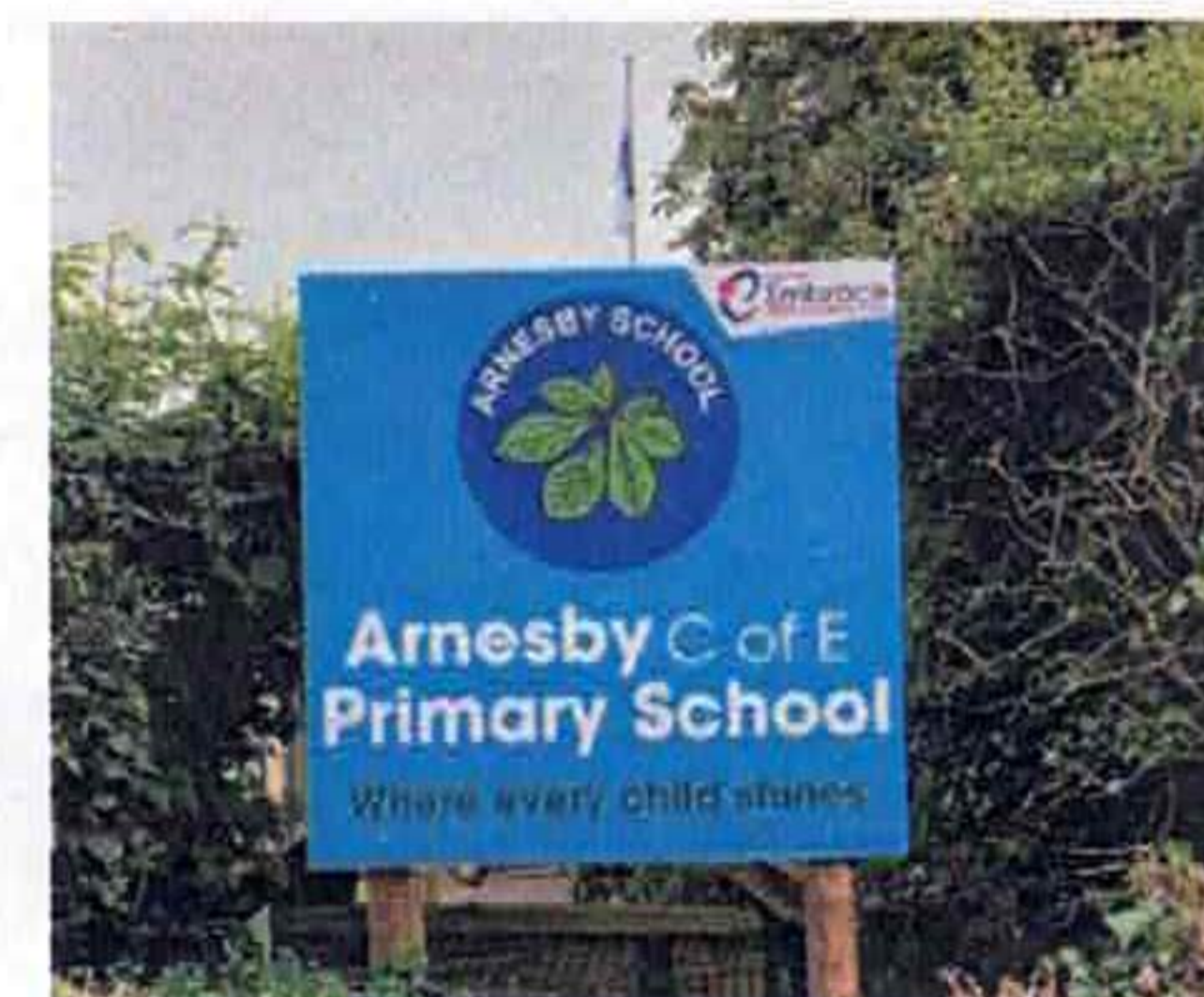
