## Faith In the Community -

#### Friends of St. Peter's, Arnesby –

One year on and we have achieved a lot in 2024. We have so far raised over £9,000 so a huge thank you to everyone who has helped and contributed so far. Recently, FOSPA and the PCC met to align on priorities for maintenance work on our lovely church. The plans will be presented to the FOSPA AGM which will be held on **Tuesday 29 January 2025** at the **Village Hall**, starting promptly at **19:30**. Plans for church restoration work and fund-raising events, and our finances, will be discussed. Please see Brian's note below which will be critical to funding our projects.

#### ST PETER'S CHURCH RESTORATION

All readers of this newsletter will be aware of the recent efforts, within the village, to raise funds for the ongoing restoration of our ancient Parish Church. You are also probably aware that the Government of France has recently spent more than £500 million to restore the splendid Notre Dame Church in Paris. You may not be aware that the UK Government is unusual in Europe because the maintenance and restoration places of worship are almost entirely the responsibility of local people. The only help provided by the UK Government to support our unique heritage of medieval churches is via "The Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme".

This scheme, set up in 2004 by Gordon Brown, allows churches to reclaim the VAT on any restoration work undertaken (bear in mind that VAT is not charged on any new build). The recent Labour budget did not include the LPWGS – so it is unlikely that it will be extended beyond March 2025. This will add a further 20% to the cost of any restoration work.

The majority of the membership of our recently formed "Friends of St Peter's Church, Arnesby" are not part of its worshipping community. I believe many subscribe to the views expressed in a recent Leading Article in "The Times", a summary of which I include below:

A house close to a preserved heritage site improves quality of life: it doesn't have to be a stately home, a famous landmark or a royal palace. It could be something as prosaic as a local museum or a village church. What's more, research by Historic England suggests, a person does not even have to interact with a venerable site in any meaningful way to feel an increased sense of life satisfaction. You don't have to participate in a conservation or renovation effort. Mere proximity to a Grade II listed building is enough to enhance an individual's wellbeing. Built history builds good mood. What is important is the sense of continuity, belonging, civic pride and security that even a modest structure provides if it has been around a while and is looked after.
